Montanazhdarcho minor

Described by Padian , de Ricqles, & Horner in 1993 this wing skeleton of an azhdarchid pterosaur of Campanian age is noted for its small size. This is characteristically a mature individual represented by fragmentary remains of the humerus, radius, distal carpal and other small fragments.
