



## Doratorhynchus validus

Represented as a single cervical vertebra from the Purbeck Limestone of Britain. Jurassic - Cretaceous border sediments. Other partial bones have been assigned to this type, including a wing phalange in the Dorchester Museum, Dorset, England. The azhdarchid association is tenuous.
