



## The Pterosaur Database

### Gnathosaurus subulatus

This pterosaur from the Solenhofen Limestone of Southern Germany is very distinctive. It has a long slim jaw with a spoon shaped end. The teeth are very fine and numerous, numbering around 130 in the jaw. Early specimens were mistaken for crocodile remains.
